Historical Note

It is unknown when this collection was originally compiled, however it was determined at that time that the great volume and importance of the material warranted a separate collection from the New Mexico Museum of Art Record Collection.

Many of the catalogs in this collection refer to exhibitions of the Museum of Art under earlier names, such as The Art Museum, Museum of New Mexico Art Gallery, Museum of Fine Arts and the School of American Research.

From 1917 when the Museum opened until 1959 what we know as the New Mexico Museum of Art was jointly operated by the Museum of New Mexico and the School of American Research (a private, non-profit organization, originally known as the School of Archaeology) until an act of the legislature separated the two. It is around this time, c. 1960, that usage of "Museum of New Mexico Art Gallery" seems to be replaced by usage of "New Mexico Museum of Fine Arts" (and even sometimes the "Fine Arts Museum of New Mexico").

The current name, The New Mexico Museum of Art, was adopted in 2007 to reflect the breadth of New Mexico art.

Scope and Content: This collection consists of the exhibition catalogs produced by the New Mexico Museum of Art since its inception in 1917. These catalogs range from single sheets of paper to bound book length publications.
